## Visiting places of detention to protect your rights



The Office of the Inspector of Correctional Services (OICS), the ACT Human Rights Commission and the ACT Ombudsman are responsible for visiting Bimberi, police cells and other places where children and young people are detained.



We visit detention places to make sure that all detained children and young people's rights are being protected, and that you are being treated well. We aim to prevent poor treatment before it happens.



When we visit we might like to speak to you, if you agree. We will keep what you tell us private, unless you give us permission to share it with other people, or if we are required to share it by law.
