AREA I Safety

- The court cells and how you are treated there
- What happens on the way to Bimberi and when you first get to Bimberi
- Searching of you and your property

- Rules for behaviour at Bimberi and what happens if you break the rules
- Incentive points
- Use of force and restraints
- Segregation and resets
- Bullying and racism at Bimberi
- o How staff treat you

Respect And dignify

- What Bimberi looks and feels like, including your cell
- What decisions you can make yourself
- Whether you feel safe at Bimberi
- The bedding, clothes and toiletries you are given to use at Bimberi
- How your property is looked after at Bimberi
- What you can buy with your incentive points
- Food and drinks
- How staff treat you and if you feel you can talk to them about important things

- o How you can make complaints about
- things at Bimberi
- Religion and culture at Bimberi
 - Whether you get treated differently because you:
 - · are on remand
 - are a female or nonbinary young person
 - are Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander
 - are under a care and protection order
 - are from a different culture or speak a different language
 - · have a disability
 - · identify as LGBTQ.
 - Health care, including the dentist, and medicine
- o Mental health care
- Help managing drug & alcohol use

 How much time you get to have out of your cell each day

- How much time you get to have outside each day
- What activities you can do at Bimberi, such as sport, music, art and games
 - Murrumbidgee School
 - How much time you get to spend with each other
 - Learning new skills



- Talking with and spending time with your family and friends e.g. visits and phone calls
- Speaking with or seeing your lawyer
- o Case management plans
- Support if you are going to be at Bimberi for a long time
- What plans are made with you and supports are in place for when you leave Bimberi
- o What programs there are at Bimberi
